

Q: When will eLearning begin and end? Will BCS virtual classrooms, credit recovery, and Acellus continue?

A: E-learning will begin on April 6. Students are encouraged to use the online resources located at http://www.bessk12.org/ during the mandatory closing of school.

Q: Will my child receive grades for eLearning assignments?

A: Yes, students will earn grades. Report cards will be mailed before or on April 17.

Q: Will Special Education timelines/IEP meetings/evaluations/re-evaluations be amended due to the closure?



A: IEP Teams are not required to meet and staff are not required to complete evaluations during Governors Ivey's mandated school closure (March 16 to April 3).

Q: I hear that Lawson State is planning on Dual Enrollment Classes to continue in a virtual format. Are we going to allow our students to do this?

A: Colleges are the authority on dual enrollment classes. Ground classes will not be held on campus after Monday, March 16th. Their plan is to resume on-campus classes on Monday, April 6th. Ground classes moved to an online delivery via Blackboard Ultra on Wednesday, March 18th. In the meantime, it is very important for students to read updates as they are announced through our website and email. This is very important, as their dual enrollment coursework will continue.

Q: What if the mandated closure is extended?

A: The state is working on guidance for schools to allow virtual learning should closure be extended and we will prepare accordingly and share that information with you.

Q: What about proms? A: To be determined.

Q: What about graduation?

A: BCHS graduation- To be determined.

B. Elementary/Middle school ceremonies, programs, extra-curricular programs are canceled for this school year.

Q: Will my child still have to pay their senior fees?

A: Yes, if there is a graduation ceremony. However, they will only be responsible for paying a fraction of their senior fees, which will be used to cover the cost of the graduation ceremony. The location of the graduation ceremony will determine the exact amount.

Q: What about all the senior activities (Class Day, Senior Picnic, Senior Luncheon, etc.)?

A: ALL activities, except graduation, are canceled.

Q: If graduation is canceled, will we receive a refund from Jostens?

A: Jostens should answer this question. Someone from the high school will contact the sales representative.

Q: Will we receive a refund on the senior trip to Six Flags?

A: Yes

Q: Will Kindergarten Registration still occur?

A: Yes, the online registration portal is available for kindergarten registration. The registration link is located on the district's website http://www.bessk12.org/.

Q: What about athletics?

A: All athletics are suspended for the remainder of this academic school year.

Q: What about field trips and other school-sponsored activities?

A: All school-sponsored activities scheduled during the statewide school closure - including field trips - are suspended for the remainder of this academic year.

Q: I have a student assigned to New Horizon Alternative School. Will this closure affect his or her assigned days?

A: March 16-April 3 will count toward the assignment.
