

Learn About Your Family Genealogy

If you've ever been curious about the origins of a certain family recipe or a longtime family tradition, now could be a great time to dive into your genealogy. While museums and libraries are currently closed, there are other options available to guide you on this amazing journey.



Birmingham is home to a local group called Birmingham African American Genealogy Group, Inc. (BAAGG). The organization is dedicated to finding the history of ancestors in and around the Jefferson County area. Simply submit a few details via email, and BAAGG will help you from there. For more information, check out baagginc.org.

Another more popular option for tracing your family's genealogy is Ancestry.com. While there is a cost associated with their work, the website allows users to create a family tree through its online database containing years of censuses, scanned documents and manually inputted data. You may even have a relative who has already begun a family tree on the website, and could help you build yours!

If your access to the internet is limited during this time, asking family members about your ancestors is another helpful idea. Go to family friends, distant relatives, and even longtime neighbors for any information they can give. They often remember more than they realize. Try keeping a journal or creating your own family tree so you can keep track and one day pass down the information to your children. Keeping family history and traditions around has the potential to deeply impact your family — instilling a sense of pride in children, enriching family support, and strengthening their inner confidence.

Once libraries reopen, check with staff about FREE resources they offer to help you on your journey. Until then, best wishes as you begin the adventurous dive into your family's history!
